Dear Reader

The reason I have not applied for a second impact study for the expansion in 2018, is because we already had consent use of approval approved 2005. For this reason I was not aware that I had to re-apply again for consent use because it was on the same property with in the same borders as consent was requested for in 2005.

As regulations were stated in the consent use given to me 2005, I have religiously been following those procedures, rules and regulations as required from us to do so.

Dagbreek eggs is a food producing company that produces one of the lowest costing protein available for human consumption

We are a paid member of SAPA ( South African Poultry Association )

Dagbreek farm supplies eggs to all major retail outlets in the Eastern Cape: shoprite, boxer, PnP, Spar and informal market

We comply to all health, food safety and waste management protocol as expected from an egg producing farm ( see attached )

Annually we have PnP audits, where we have to comply with their health and food safety protocol, and we achieve a 95% plus every year for the past 10 years.

Chicken manure runs directly from the chicken houses on conveyer belts onto trucks and is transported off the farm three times per week. The manure never stays on the farm nor stored on the ground anywhere on the premises.

Chicken mortalities are counted and loaded daily by a local pig farmer free of charge to him, and he processes them before feeding to his pigs.

Old birds, >70 weeks of age, and decreased in laying production are culled once a week. We load them and transport them to a cull buyer situated in Motherwell – Port Elizabeth on a weekly basis. From there is sells and supplies them to the informal settlements in that area.

Monthly inspection of operations and health of the hens are being done by Dr Bosman our registered Poultry veterinarian. ( see attached )

Annually we allocate a percentage of donations to NGO's in our area, whether it is money or eggs that we donate.

We employ 50 permanent farm workers that reside in Humansdorp/Jeffreys Bay, and 10-30 casual workers once a month depending on the requirements of increased production. They are transported daily in and out with a private transport company that supplies the service to us.

Part of our employment contract is a provident fund that the employee and our company allocate 5% of monthly salary too.
